

We are thankful! As we enter November, we are beginning the 2nd Quarter. Thanksgiving break will be November 27-29. We reopen Monday, December 2. We especially appreciate everyone's efforts to avoid taking extra days off during the Thanksgiving holiday. Just a few days here and there, even if they're excused absences, can add up to too much lost learning time and leave your child behind in school. This is true at every grade level in school.

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
Exchange Club Student of the Month







